How do the new meters help the environment?

They'll help in several ways. Since meter readers will no longer need to read every meter each month,

that will reduce pollution, fuel consumption, and traffic. Also, the meters will let us use new technologies that will allow you to make decisions about using less energy, at your discretion, which can reduce the amount of electricity demand.

quency (RF) fields?

Yes. Smart meters emit about 1 watt. This is less than the 1 to 2 watts emitted by cell phones or wireless routers. Smart meters transmit radio signals only once every four hours with each transmission lasting only 5/100ths of a second).

Are smart meter RF fields safe?

Yes. Key factors for exposure risk are the power and frequency of the emission and the distance from a person. Smart meters emit only about 1 watt and, when installed, no transmitter is located within the home. Cell phones are considered riskier since they're held to the head.

Although our smart meters meet all FCC testing and certification, SMUD took the extra step of including vigorous RF testing during the initial rollout. Even when meters are grouped together such as at apartment complexes, their RF emissions are low compared to FCC exposure guide-<u>lines.</u>

Will smart meter RF fields interfere with my electronics or medical devices?

SMUD's smart meters have been certified by the FCC and shouldn't interfere with devices in or around your home.

Do smart meters generate radio fre- pared for power failures and other emergencies. Since the District's groundwater wells require electrical power to produce water and maintain pressure in the distribution system, SSWD has invested in 35 back-up generators and drive engines to keep wells operating and maintain pressure in the event of a power outage. Today, SSWD is pursuing diverse tools, including water use efficiency, groundwater management and conjunctive use, and water quality protection and treatment, to deliver sustainable water service now and into the future. Locally created and locally governed, SSWD is equipped to plan, build and operate critically important infrastructure such as pipelines, treatment plants, groundwater wells and pumping stations. That translates into reliable service that keeps local dollars local. In short, water service from SSWD remains one of the best deals around.

Members of Eastern Gardens are permitted a Prorata deduction under In-



ternal Revenue Code Section 216 for mortgage interest and property taxes paid to a cooperative housing corporation. At the close of every year

Eastern Gardens and FPI management is audited for both financially and compliance by an outside independent bookkeeping company. The report from the audited will be available sometime in March or early April. In addition to the audit the bookkeeping company also prepares the memberships Prorata portion, which is deductible if you itemize deductions on your 2013 individual income tax return. The Prorata portion report will be available to the membership in mid or late January at Eastern Garden's business office. NOTE: If you were a member for less than a full year during 2013 you must prorate your deduction accordingly. This is explained

in the Prorata report. For additional information please contact your tax preparer or consultant.
